
What is the VPNYEE?

VPNYEE Webinars STIMULATING DEMAND FOR YOUTH LABOUR

- ✓ Cost of Incentives is high and evidence of effectiveness is mixed
- ✓ Anchor programmes and incentives to performance (rules-based, not ad-hoc)
- ✓ Target highest benefit investments
- ✓ Review periodically and streamline/ rationalise MSE Support progs.
