

### Measurement of disability: New style (Washington Group) questions


- 1. Do you have difficulty seeing, even if wearing glasses?

- c. Yes a lot of difficulty;


d. Cannot do at all.

2. Do you have difficulty hearing, even if using a hearing aid?

- 3. Do you have difficulty walking or climbing steps?
- 4. Do you have difficulty remembering or concentrating?
- 5. Do you have difficulty (with self-care such as) washing all over or dressing?

6. Using your usual (customary) language, do you have difficulty communicating, for example understanding or being understood?











# Disability by age in Trinidad and Tobago (number and percentage of persons with disabilities by age), 2011




# Disability by age and severity in Grenada (number of persons), 2011


# Disability by age and severity in Grenada (percentages), 2011



### Older persons with disabilities

- Does an 80 year old in need of nursing care have a disability (or disabilities) or are they just old?
- We don't tend to think of old people, particularly those over 70 and 80, who have functional impairments (e.g. visual, hearing, mobility, concentration, dexterity) as having a disability....we just tend to think of them as old.
- Older persons with disabilities have the same right to rehabilitation, assistive devices, adaptions to the environment, reasonable accommodation etc. as younger persons with disabilities.
- Failing to recognise this, leads to double discrimination.
