- b. Contribute to the adaptation of the United Nations recommendations on the capture of census data for Latin America and the Caribbean.

Main obstacles encountered

- Defining the scope of the document, particularly with respect to methods of electronic capture.
- Implications of the method of capture on statistical quality.
- The workload of the coordinating teams has delayed the drafting of the document more than expected.

Best practices implemented

- Incorporation of countries of the group in the systematization of their experiences. Country fact sheets and presentation sessions were conducted through videoconferences.
 - 1 session Optical Readers (Ecuador and Chile);
 - 2 sessions DMC (Venezuela, Colombia, Mexico, Brazil, Costa Rica)
 - 2 sessions WEB (Chile, Colombia, Mexico, Brazil)
- Meetings with CELADE to define the scope and joint drafting of the document.

- Adjustments to the Draft by INE-Chile and CELADE (April-May)
- Review with countries of the group and with countries that shared their experiences (June-July)
- Post-review adjustments with countries (August)
- Preparation of Final Document (September-October)
- Delivery of Final Document (November)
