- High rates of 'brain drain'
- Barrel Economy/ financial remittances = Resilience and stability
- Increased intra-regional migration= brain circulation




Focus










ACS' 4 Areas of Focus

- Dialogue and best practice exchange between mechanisms/ policies- OECS, CARICOM, Cuba, Mexico);
- Partnerships between governments, specialised institutions (e.g. ACS/ IOM), private sector;
- Diaspora/ migration lens applied to cooperation
- Data/ Statistics

The 7th ACS Summit, 2016 Havana Declaration reiterates:

- rofound commitment to the upholding of human rights of migrants, irrespective of their migration status...
- > ...the need for regular, orderly and safe migration..
- >...Social, cultural and economic contributions of migrants irrespective of their migration status




A role for Regional Organisations
