Vision

 An active Private Sector Network (PSN) of representatives working in a mutually beneficial collaboration with the members of UN-GGIM: Americas to play a leading role in setting the agenda for the development of regional geospatial information and to promote its use to address key regional challenges, enable citizen services and support the initiatives of the United Nations, particularly the global development agenda.

Purpose

- The Private Sector Network Americas (PSNA) is intended to facilitate a direct connection and communication for the private sector to work with Member States towards achieving success in regional geospatial initiatives. 


